We have enjoyed welcoming students back to school and I have been pleased to see students returning in the right frame of mind and ready to learn: students have returned with a clear focus and the right attitude for learning.

An area of focus this year with students is to improve independence in learning – we want Plympton Academy students to feel empowered so that they can complete work and achieve their best in any assessments they complete.

To help students develop their independence further outside of the classroom, we are making changes to our homework policy. Home learning will be set by individual subject teachers. Students will be informed of the task and handing in instructions which will be accessible on Classcharts including the hand in date. The tasks given should take approximately 20 minutes for KS3 and 30 minutes for KS4. This may vary at times for some subjects but reasonable time scales will be given to complete homework to a good standard.

Students will be expected to complete all home learning to the best of their ability and will be rewarded when providing outstanding homework. As a result of these changes, there may be some days where students are set more homework than others. To help your child organise their week, please find our suggested homework completion timetable below. This will ensure that your child is not overstretched if multiple pieces are set on the same day.
