

Evidence supporting hypothesis

- Pedestrians like Cabot Circus this is the busiest area
- EQI generally good* across Bristol, especially CC.
- Questionnaire data showing particular areas are seen as good / ok (CC and Broadmead)
- Scatter showing positive correlation between EQI and ped. Count (as expected)

Evidence against the hypothesis

- Evidence suggests Galleries has suffered (Not as good EQI / Ped. count not as high)
- Transects showing negative impact the further away you go from CC
- Clone town suggesting its 'like everywhere else'
- Traffic count doesn't really tell us anything

Conclusion - Overall

Overall

- Some supporting evidence but only suggesting that CC area has improved
- Closer you go to CC, the better the area becomes
- Galleries / bottom of Broadmead have suffered
 possibility of shopping centre impact
- Therefore, has the whole CBD benefited?
- We can argue something to a degree.


